Results with Fungicide

- The next pictures show roses infected by “**powdery mildew**”, a common fungal infection. The “ill” looking cutting received a treatment of Dithane (a fungicide) with obvious inferior results (this may be due to the severity of the infection) whilst the “healthier” looking cutting was treated with both Dithane and CYFLO.
- Similar results have been observed on **TOMATOES** grown in a sub-tropical environment where the control of the PMD fungi, by means of CYFLO has become standard practice. The application rate on the tomatoes varies from 5ml to 10 ml /100 liters of water applied during the spray.
